Killbuck District Spring Camporee Gold Prospecting at Peewee Hollow. We will be prospecting in the creeks for gold, very good chance we will find gold. Friday night camp songs. Saturday night Vesper and campfire.

Cost:

\$ 10.00 per person or Adult \$5.00 for patch only

Registration:

Registration will be held Friday evening April 26th, 2019 at the camp pavilion from 6:00 pm to 9:00 pm. Complete attached roster forms and turn in along with fees during registration. Troops arriving later than 9:00 or on Saturday morning, registration will be at the pavilion at 7:00am-8:00am on Saturday, April 27, 2019. The event will promptly start at 8:30 am!

Materials Needed:

Waterproof boots and work gloves. There are a lot of sharp objects in the creek. When scouts are at bridge they will be in creek. Must wear boots. Will have time to change shoes before start or at lunch.

Parking Areas:

DO NOT PARK ANY VEHICLES ON ANY OF THE ROADWAYS! The roadways must be open to allow for emergency vehicles and ease of travel. This also includes a circle around the new cabin (Pee Wee Hilton). Park all vehicles and trailers in the main parking area by the pavilion, or either of the two parking areas to the east of the pavilion along the road into camp.

Camping Areas:

Units are permitted to camp anywhere in camp as follows; Not within 100 feet of cabin or wells, any area that is posted as closed, or designated by the event staff as 'not to be used'. Please respect the troops 'normal' camping areas.

Health:

The porta-potties are there for all to use. However, in the past there are those who do not clean up after themselves and leave for the next person to deal with. Please be respectful of those who will use the potties after you.

Safety:

All safety precautions will be adhered to throughout the Camporee. Report all unsafe conditions and actions to a staff member or executive staff member immediately. If the action is unsafe, stop the action and report the event staff. Scouts, use the buddy system. Closed toe shoes or boots, No sandals or water shoes

First Aid:

Scout leaders are to be prepared to handle all minor situations. Each unit is to have a first aid kit in their campsite. Serious injuries and emergencies must be reported immediately to the Camporee Headquarters at the camp pavilion. Units having additional trained medical personnel are asked to notify the event staff during check-in or at the Scoutmaster /SPL/ ASPL meeting on Friday night. There are 2 full-service hospitals nearby:

Wooster Community Hospital (1761 Beal Ave, Wooster 44691)

Lodi Community Hospital (225 Elyria St. Lodi 44254)

Uniforms:

Class B uniform. Be prepared to wear weather appropriate gear. Waterproof boots and work gloves. There is a high probability that participants will get very wet be prepared to change at least once during Saturday

Water:

All wells are currently usable.

Campfires:

Campfires are permitted at Pee Wee Hollow unless otherwise noted. Campfires must be located at least ten feet away from trees and exposed roots. Do not leave fires unattended. Make certain at the end of your stay that your campfire is fully extinguished. Do not leave unused firewood in field or trail areas. Move to two feet inside tree line so it is not mowing obstacle next spring. Troops, please plan on making your own arrangements for firewood you plan to use over the weekend. While there will be firewood at the pavilion, stations, and cabin that wood is to be used for those respective areas. Be prepared.

Visitors:

Visitors are the responsibility of their respective units. Provide event staff with a list of names of your unit's visitors and when they will be present at the event.

Trash:

Pack it in, pack it out. Leave no trace.

Program/ Event Details:

This weekend program will allow the patrols to see a couple areas of camp that maybe they have not seen in a while or before. The patrols will visit 6 stations, 3 near the bridge and 3 near the cabin. We will be prospecting for gold 6 different ways and some history.

Near Bridge

Station 1: Geology

General information about geology including the formation of shales and sandstones that are commonly found in Peewee.

Station 2: Dredge

Hands on demonstration of a gold suction dredge in the creeks to process sand and gravel to recover gold through a sluice. We will also demonstrate how to use a small hand sluice in the creek.

Station 3: High banker

Hands on demonstration of a high banker sluice where scouts will shovel gravel into the high banker to process them in a sluice to recover gold.

Station 4: Panning

Demonstration and hands on gold panning

Station 5: Ohio Gold History

Historical information of how gold was found in Ohio, how it was brought from Canada on the glaciers and how to find areas where gold accumulates.

Station 6: Indian Burial Mounds

History of burial mounds

Clean up gold:

Demonstration of how concentrates from the sluices are worked on smaller equipment to separate the gold from the other sands. We will find out if there is gold in Peewee at this station.
