

Every patrol must have the following items:

- a. Klondike sled built of natural material (fastened together by any means), to push or pull. **Be advised:** City Mayors hold discretion to judge their station properly, including whether a patrol has a sled or not, and whether it is built of natural materials by patrol members or just a hand-me-down. (Hint: a sled built of natural materials & teamwork may be considered more valuable than a 1970s model.) **Webelos may use any type of sled.**
- b. Compass
- c. Pen/Pencil & Note pad
- d. First Aid kit
- e. Scout book
- f. Three 6-8ft poles
- g. Natural wood and tinder for 2 (two) fires
- h. 20ft piece of bailing twine
- i. Blanket
- j. Cooking equipment
- k. Matches and lighter
- l. 6ft piece of knot rope per patrol member
- m. One pair of heavy gloves
- n. Whistle
- o. Mess kit and drink per patrol member
- p. One gallon sized plastic bag
- q. Dutch oven and large spoon
- r. One gallon of water
- s. Shovel for digging fire pit
- t. One 8'x10' or Larger Tarp
- u. Three (3) empty 2-liter pop bottles
- v. Bandannas/Blindfolds per patrol member. **[Continued on NEXT PAGE>]**

Patrols will cook waterless stew for Lunch. Each patrol shall provide the following:

- One stick of butter or margarine
- Add any seasoning as desired.
- AT LEAST 1/2 cup per patrol member of:

Potatoes

Carrots

Stew meat

-In addition to waterless stew, patrols may bring anything else they want to eat for lunch.

ALL WATERLESS STEW INGREDIENTS MUST BE COOKED AT THE LUNCH STATION---Points deduction for use of pre-cooked ingredients.
