GENERAL INFORMATION

REGISTRATION

Registration opens for all Cub Camping events on October 1 of each year for the upcoming summer. All Scouts register online at

www.buckeyecouncil.org/cubscoutcamping. Click on the type of camping event you wish to attend and register online. Cub Scout packs may wish to have one person from their pack register the pack as a whole. For Webelos Resident Camp, packs are only allowed to register as a pack "contingent." For all other camps, individuals may register themselves.

PAYMENT

Full payment is due at the time of registration for all Cub Scout events, with the exception of Day Camp and Resident Camp. Day Camp requires a non-refundable deposit of \$30 and Resident Camp requires a non-refundable deposit of \$25 to secure space in each session requested, with the full payment due on June 1. Payments may be made by credit card, debit card, or electronic check for contingent registration. Additional spending money may be required for the trading post available at all camp sessions.

CAMPERSHIPS

Families that have a financial need my apply once per year for financial assistance. Limited funds are available to support participation in Councilsponsored programs and events. To apply, complete the campership application and submit the request. Campership candidates must be in good financial standing with the Buckeye Council, BSA, and current registered members. Camperships are due each year on March 1. For more information, go to www.buckeyecouncil.org/cubscoutcamping.

CAMP DISCOUNTS

Camp discounts are offered throughout the year for various activities or circumstances. See below for Cub Scout Camp discounts offered for 2018:

- Resident Camp & Day Camp = \$20 off Cub/Webelos Resident Camp
- Buddy Card Blitz = \$10 off camp for buddy cards turned in during September 2018
- Camp Cash = \$5 off for every \$50 invested into the Investment in Character Campaign
- **Popcorn Sale** = amount varies Codes for earned passes are delivered electronically via email. Camp discounts must be applied to the camp at the time of registration in the field labeled discount code during check out. REFUNDS

Participants who request a refund 30 days or more before a camp session will receive a refund. Deposits made on Day Camp or Resident Camp sessions are non-refundable. In some cases, a partial refunds may be granted for a family or medical emergency. A refund request form must be completed to receive any type of refund, go to <u>www.buckeyecouncil.org/cubscoutcamping</u> to find a refund request form.



MEMBERSHIP

All youth participating in Cub Camping Programs must be a registered member of the BSA. To complete a membership registration, go to <u>BeAScout.org</u>. Any adult spending the night at Cub Scout or Webelos Resident Camp must also be a registered member of the BSA, and completed Youth Protection Training.

MEDICAL FORMS

A current medical form is required for all adults and Scouts at camp. A Boy Scouts of America form is to be filled out by all participants prior to camp. Parts A and B are required for all participants attending Day Camp. Parts A, B, and C are required for all Resident Camps. All forms are returned to campers at the end of camp. Find the medical form at <u>www.buckeyecouncil.org/cubscoutcamping</u>. No Scout or adult will be permitted at camp without a medical form.

*Part C of the medical form requires a physician's signature.



CAMP STAFF

Our dedicated camp staff is on-site to guide each Scout's camp experience. All staff are registered members of the BSA, completed Youth Protection Training, and received a background check. Younger staff members, typically Scouts (ages 14-17), are supervised at all times and completed Youth Protection Training. All camp staff are trained in safety and security of Scouts, emergency procedures, programming, and First Aid and CPR certified.

BRING A FRIEND

We know that it's important for Scouts to attend camp with a friend! All Day Camps and Twilight Camps have a "Bring A Friend" day on the Wednesday* of camp. Friends can come for free to experience camp for the first time on Bring A Friend Day. Friends are invited back for the rest of the week at a prorated cost that includes the rest of camp and registration for Cub Scouts. *Bring A Friend Day varies from camp to camp, however it is typically on Wednesday of camp.

SPECIAL NEEDS

The Buckeye Council, Boy Scouts of America strives to make accommodations for Scouts with special needs and/or dietary restrictions. Depending on the camp, some areas of camp might not be accessible. Each Scout brings a packed lunch to Day Camps, but Resident Camp has a dining hall. If you have dietary restrictions, make sure to contact your camp director to ensure a safe and enjoyable camp experience.
