



***Cub Scout Summer Camp is the newest and best way for your scouts to have an overnight camping experience this year! We're offering 12, 4-day, 3-night, sessions for Scouts, leaders, and parents to attend camp from Wolves through Webelos rank. There's never been so many camping opportunities and we hope you'll spread the message!***

### ***Who can attend?***

Cub Scout Summer Camp is open to all Scouts who cross over in spring of 2020 to the **Wolf, Bear, Webelos, or Arrow of Light Rank**. This means current tigers and up are eligible to attend.

### ***What about adults?***

Cub Scout Summer Camp is open to all adults and parents of Cub Scouts! All Wolf and Bear Scouts must have a parent attend with them. Webelos may attend as a den with 4-5 den leaders alongside the Scouts, or as a family. Any adult spending the night Cub Scout Summer Camp must be a registered member of the BSA, and complete Youth Protection Training. To complete Youth Protection Training, go to [my.scouting.org](http://my.scouting.org). All Scouts and adults attending a multi-day summer camp must fill out the BSA medical form parts A, B, and C.

### ***What happened to WRC?***

Webelos Resident Camp (WRC) is now called Cub Scout Summer Camp where Webelos and Arrow of Light scouts can attend as they had in the past. Wolf and Bear scouts are now invited to participate in their own programs during the same time. This allows packs to attend as a pack, families to go on a longer camping trip, and provides more options for Wolf and Bear scouts to go camping.

### ***What will the Hawk award look like?***

Webelos and Arrow of Light Scouts will still participate and receive a Hawk award as they have in the past. Wolves and Bears will participate and receive a Tomahawk Award. They will receive a brass bead for each year at Cub Scout Summer Camp.

### ***Two of my children are attending camp but are different ranks, do I have to have two adults at camp?***

No, families that have multiple children attending Cub Scout Summer Camp can bring one parent to camp but only if they are in the same family. The parent will have to split time with both children during camp.

### ***What if an adult cannot attend the entire camp session?***

This is very common. We often see adults split camp sessions. For example, one adult comes Sunday to Monday and another comes Monday to Wednesday. If help is needed, contact the Buckeye Council. Adult leadership is an important part of the Scout camp experience.

### ***Does this mean we can attend as a pack?***

Yes, packs can attend a session of camp together, however incoming lions and tigers are not permitted to attend. It is a camp standard that lions and tigers cannot camp overnight for longer than a weekend.

### ***Registration shows \$260 for wolf and bear registration, but only \$170 for webelos. Why?***

Wolf and bear scouts must have an adult attend with them, therefore the \$260 is the youth and adult price (\$170 + \$90 = \$260). Webelos are encouraged to attend with their den with 4-5 den leaders.

### ***Will there be separate programs for each rank?***

Yes, there will be different programs for each rank. There will be rank-specific activity pins/belt loops earned throughout the duration of camp and these will be completed in a rank-specific atmosphere.

***Is there a deposit to secure my spot?***

Cub Scout Summer Camps require a non-refundable deposit of \$25 to secure space in each session. Full payment for those camps is due 14 days prior to arrival. Payments can be made by credit card, debit card, or electronic check. Additional spending money may be needed for the trading post available at all camps.

***Do all adults have to be registered members of the BSA and bring a medical form?***

Yes, any adult spending the night at a multi-day summer camp must also be a registered member of the BSA, and complete Youth Protection Training. A current medical form is required for all adults and Scouts at camp. A Boy Scouts of America medical form is to be filled out by all participants prior to camp. Parts A, B, and C are required for all multi-day summer camps. All forms are returned to campers at the end of camp. No Scout or adult will be permitted at camp without a medical form. *\*Part C of the medical form requires a physician's signature.*

***Are there camperships available?***

Families that have a financial need may apply once per year for financial assistance. Limited funds are available to support participation in Council-sponsored programs and events. To apply, complete the campership application and submit the request. Campership candidates must be in good financial standing with the Buckeye Council, BSA, and current registered members. ***Are there any discounts available for camp?***

Camp discounts are offered throughout the year for various activities or circumstances. See below for Scout Camp discounts offered for 2019-2020:

- Attending both Cub Scout Summer Camp & Day/Twilight Camp = **\$20 off** Cub Scout Summer Camp
- NYLT and Summer Camp = **\$50 off** summer camp
- Buddy Card Blitz = **\$10 off** camp for buddy cards turned in during September 2019
- Sibling Discount = **\$10 off** per sibling
- Popcorn Sale = amount varies

Yes webelos may attend camp without a den, but must have a parent attend alongside the Scout.
